| 1. | A fence may be installed along Beach Road and Ditch Road this Season limiting access to many blinds, including 15, 15A, 16, etc | TRUE | FALSE |
| 2. | Hunting locations 18, 39, 41 and the 70's are open all day weekends With no restrictions just like all other blinds. | TRUE | FALSE |
| 3. | It is mandatory that a current email address be provided on the shotgun registration sheet. This email must be checked after 6PM Friday in case of weekend notices for those assigned hunting locations 18, 39, 41 and the 70's. | TRUE | FALSE |
| 4. | On weekends, you can hunt in locations 18, 39, 41 and the 70's all day long only if you have a radio checked out and you maintain verbal contact with the Tower for possible instructions (Vacate, etc). | TRUE | FALSE |
| 5. | Boats are required for all ESA locations | TRUE | FALSE |
| 6. | Primary phone number for waterfowl Information (including blind assignments or cancellations) during hunting season is the duty Waterfowl Committee representative at <u>805-890-7245</u> | TRUE | FALSE |
| 7. | A boat is required for blinds 11-14. | TRUE | FALSE |
| 8. | It is unlawful to use devices that are either electronically-powered, or activated by anything other than natural wind, to cause rotation of decoy blades that simulate wings, when attempting to take waterfowl between the start of the season and November 30th. | TRUE | FALSE |
| 9. | Blinds are assigned on a priority basis on hunting days prescribed in NBVC Environmental Operational Procedure "Waterfowl Hunting Annual Information – Dates and Times". These days include ONLY Wednesdays prior to 0700, and Saturday and Sunday | TRUE | FALSE |
| 10. | In order to participate in the new veteran hunt weekend in February the hunter must provide proof of veteran status. This includes DoD civilians and guests (active and retired exempted because they already have provided proof) | TRUE | FALSE |
| 11. | You may use dogs in all hunting locations. | TRUE | FALSE |
| 12. | Hunters authorized to hunt alone on NBVC (except DBIS contractors) are authorized to sponsor a guest. The sponsor is responsible for all actions of his guest including registration, test, insuring he has a Hunters Access Card and the word <u>GUEST</u> entered in the priority block of the guest's Blind Request | TRUE | FALSE |
| 13. | All first time hunters (except guests) must present their military affiliated ID in person upon registering. They must also take a hunting area tour. | TRUE | FALSE |

24.	Hunters need to bring their own seating and temporary camo for hunting locations 40, 41, 74, 75 and all ESA locations because they are not permanent blinds. They must also leave the identifying pole marking the location standing at all times.	TRUE	FALSE
